## **INSTRUCTIONS FOR RECEIVING CONTINUING LEGAL EDUCATION (CLE) CREDITS**

The International Technology Law Association, Inc. (ITechLaw) is **not** an approved continuing legal education provider in any jurisdiction at this time. That does not mean you are not eligible for credit in your jurisdiction(s). Most jurisdictions permit individual course credit as long as you can prove attendance. Each jurisdiction has local rules for evaluating individual CLE credit. Go to the website of your state licensing authority for details. There is a uniform application for most jurisdictions or a required special form in others. You need to check to see what is required in each place you are admitted (i.e. CA, NY and PA -- among others -- have special forms that you download from their sites). This process is completed by you directly and ITechLaw is not a party to the application.

Refer to your local rules in order to determine how many credit hours the conference or event represents as jurisdictions vary as to calculation methods. Many require that you send a copy of the conference brochure, handouts and other documentation. Speakers at a conference are eligible for credit for the presentation and possibly "prep" time. Again, you must consult your local rules for details. Filing fees are usually required. Note: there were no separate "ethics" lectures in 2006.

Jurisdictions outside the United States that have mandatory continuing legal education (for example, The Netherlands, Ireland) can use the uniform application and submit other materials showing attendance based on their local rules.
